[African-American] Taylor, Jimmie. *Uncle Jimmie; or a True Story of a Slave's Life.* South Bend, Ind., 1909. Photocopy, but only surviving copy. Born in 1822 a slave, Uncle Jimmie was separated from his mother when he was five, subjected to hard work and cruelty, sold from Virginia to Tennessee, back to Virginia. In 1867 he told his daughter his story, she copied down his words; he was used by both armies in the Civil War (the North didn't treat him well) escaped to Indiana, became successful, managed to pay for wife and children to come; an interesting and unknown slave narrative.

[Biography & Autobiography] Forbes, Stella Rogers. *By the Rivers of Water. Being a Brief Sketch of the Life of Sampson Rogers*. Privately printed, 1933. Rogers was born in England in 1851. The family planned to come to America in 1861 but was prevented by the Civil War, arriving in 1867. Rogers and family worked the coal in Pennsylvania; he left home, farmed in Colorado, went to Ellsworth, Kansas, drove Texas cattle to Illinois, later became a successful businessman, joined Primitive Methodist Church, bank director, etc.

[Biography & Autobiography] Glenn, John C. Reverend Drury Harrington Colquette. *The Worker and his Work*. Little Rock, Arkansas, October, 1927. Circuit rider, agent for American Bible Society for Arkansas, prison, hospital work, etc.

[Biography & Autobiography] Haden, J. N. *Life and Sayings of Metz Joiner, the Nine-Year-Old Boy Preacher*. [Sherman, Tex.]: Reynolds & Parker, 1901. 20 p.

Albion Parris Howe fought in the Mexican War at Vera Cruz, Cerro Gordo, Mexico City; and with the Army of the Potomac in the Civil War; Marshall Spring Howe fought in the Seminole War, against the Cheyenne in 1857, Etc. Albion Howe fought in the Civil War and was killed in the Modoc War.

[Biography & Autobiography] Perkins, Joseph D. *Autobiography, Reminiscences and Recollections of Joseph D. Perkins of Carthage Missouri*. Carthage, Missouri, 1932. Born in Farmington, Missouri in 1851, Perkins became an able lawyer in the area before moving to Carthage in 1883. He knew John F. Phillips, who defended Frank James, knew General Shelby, who sat drunk at James' trial.

[Biography & Autobiography] Small, Hugh L. *Hugh L. Small. His Life. History Autobiography. A True Colorful Complete and Interesting Story*. Fort Worth, 1938. Born in Tennessee in 1878, Small left for Texas when he was 15. He became a cowboy, decided he should get educated, at Azle College, then homesteaded in the Panhandle, went to Oklahoma, Reno, Lawton, sold paint to the Indians (managed to get Gerinomo's autograph), after trading with his sometime, went back to Fort Worth, became a lawyer, a judge, etc.

[Biography & Autobiography] Trask, Leonard. *The Life and Sufferings of Leonard Trask. The Wonderful Invalid*. Portland, 1858. Trask, once healthy, fell off his horse, and with other minor accidents, his condition worsened; the sketch on the cover does not seem to be exaggerated.

[Biography] Andrews, Robert W. *The Life and Adventures of Capt. W. Roberts, of Sumter, South Carolina, extending over a period of 97 years, etc*. Boston, 1887. Andrews was a remarkably healthy man, walking over much of America. Born in Statesburg, South Carolina, he left home at 12 in 1812 to carry cotton from South Carolina to Boston. He traveled everywhere after that, Alabama, Louisiana, Texas. He was in the 22<sup>nd</sup> S. C. Regiment in the Civil War, wounded twice (he extracted one of the bullets himself). He was police chief in Sumter but resigned in 1884 to walk the country on foot. In 1887, at age 97 he was still going.
