OBJECTIVES

- Perform comprehensive financial planning services with an emphasis on high-quality client service.
- Acquire the educational requirements needed to sit for the CFP® Certification Examination.
- Earn a certificate in Financial Planning from SMU.
- Course level: graduate/post-baccalaureate.

EXPERIENCED INSTRUCTORS

All courses are taught by instructors with extensive professional experience. All instructors have the CFP® certification, an advanced academic degree (MBA, JD, etc.) or other appropriate professional licenses or designations (CPA, CFA, etc.). Instructors use the financial planning topics as outlined by the Certified Financial Planner Board of Standards, Inc. as a framework for teaching the courses.

The course curriculum was developed by integrating the CFP Board's required topics list, traditional textbook curriculum and a well-known CFP® Certification Examination text. The result is a program that combines sound financial planning principles, theory and strategy with practical skills development and implementation. PREREQUISITES

All registrants must have earned a Bachelor's degree before beginning the program. No particular major or emphasis is required. The CFP Board requires candidates for CFP® certification to hold a Bachelor's degree before they receive the CFP® certification.

Students are required to attend an Orientation Session during their first quarter of the program. Students have four years to matriculate in the SMU Program. The intensive, nine-month Plano program is designed for those working in the financial industry or with financial experience.

COURSEWORK

Each main campus (Dallas) course meets for three hours once a week in the evenings for 11 weeks. You should be able to complete the entire program in approximately 21 months by taking one class each week, or in as little as one year by taking two classes each week on the Pacesetter Path. Intensive, nine-month (Plano) courses meet on Tuesday evenings and alternating Saturdays, from mid-January through mid-September.

You may transfer coursework from another CFP Board-registered program in which a grade of B or higher was achieved. Requests must be made in writing to the director, and an official transcript of record from your school must be sent along with course descriptions from the school's catalog. Final approval will be made by the director. You must complete at least 50 percent of your coursework in the SMU Program (including the capstone course: Financial Planning Strategies & Case Studies), exclusive of transfer credit.
