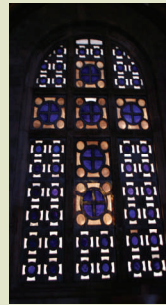




# Conflict and Trauma in Israel and the Palestinian Authority

July 3-10, 2011



Join us for a seven-day immersion into this deeply historic, complex and intriguing region.

## **COURSE DESCRIPTION:**

Instructors Dan Rainey and Miki Kidron have created an outstanding course combining traditional lecture and discussion with a comprehensive experiential component. The unique focus of this class explores the ongoing conflict, and resultant trauma, by placing it in the context of the geographic, social, political and religious elements which drive and perpetuate it.

Site visits to the Old City, The Garden of Gethsemane, Bethlehem, Haifa, Neve Shalom and other iconic locations are included. Students will also be exposed to Israel's ongoing effort to deal with the effects of conflict through a visit and lecture series at the Israel Trauma Counseling Center and the Holocaust Museum in Jerusalem.

## **GENERAL INFORMATION:**

Students will spend 7 nights at the Beit Maierdsdorf Faculty Club Guest House affiliated with Hebrew University in Jerusalem, as well as one night in Haifa. Due to the extensive traveling essential to this class, all participants must be students; however, friends, spouses, alumni, and significant others may participate in the class for non-credit at a reduced tuition rate. It is recommended that students plan to fly in and out of Tel Aviv.

## **COST:**

The cost is \$2250 room and board per person. SMU tuition and airfare are separate. Non-credit tuition is \$1304.00; for-credit students pay the standard \$2220.00 per class rate. Students are responsible for obtaining their airfare and making travel arrangements to the Faculty Club in Jerusalem.

## **RESERVATIONS:**

The class is limited to 24 students. A non-refundable deposit of \$500 is required upon making your reservation. The balance will be due April 1, 2011. Tuition is due according to regular registration policies and deadlines. There are no refunds unless we are able to refill the slot.
