### HEALTH INSURANCE DOCUMENTATION For Non-Student J-1 Visa Holders

SMU non-student J-1 visa holders are required to have medical insurance for themselves and their families for their entire time in the United States. Failure to maintain health insurance can result in deportation.

For the personal safety of the visitor, a health insurance card containing name and phone number of the insurance company must be carried at all times.
