

Rena Pederson

As Editor at Large for *The Dallas Morning News*, Rena Pederson writes a weekly column as well as special features and newsmaker profiles. Previously, she served for 16 years as a vice president and editorial page editor. The winner of numerous journalism awards, she was a finalist for the Pulitzer Prize in editorial writing in 1992. She has written two books: *What's Next? Women Redefining Their Dreams in the Prime of Life* and *What's Missing? The Faith Factor for Women*.

Texas Monthly honored her in 1987 as one of the most powerful women in Texas and the Women's Issues Network in 1997 named her one of the "pioneers for women" in Dallas. Ms. Pederson chairs the Dallas Committee on Foreign Relations and serves on the boards of the Dallas Historical Society, SMU's Tate Lecture Series, and the Dallas Museum of Natural History. She is co-chair of the Pulitzer Prize Board.

Ms. Pederson earned a B.A. in journalism with honors from the University of Texas at Austin and a Master's in journalism from Columbia University. Before joining *The News* she worked for United Press International, the Associated Press, and the Washington Bureau of the *Houston Chronicle*.
