2012 Presidential Recognition Award Winners

Krystal Jones – Gretchen C. Voight New Employee Excellence Award*

The Gretchen C. Voight New Employee Excellence Award winner is known for her strong commitment to SMU students. Krystal Jones began her work at SMU in the fall of 2011 as a Residential Community Director for the Residence Life and Student Housing division of Student Affairs. As stated by a colleague, "All residential community directors have a responsibility to contribute toward the division's core focus of creating an exemplary division of student affairs. However, Krystal has gone above and beyond her job responsibilities. Particularly, she has demonstrated independent action and resourcefulness in the area of student development in relationship to residential living and student support." Krystal has served as a mentor to many students, has led and supported the "Food Chain" discussion group, and started a program called "You Are Not Alone" to support students who have lost a family member. Krystal has made a significant contribution to her department and to SMU in the short one and a half years she has worked here.

Alexa Taylor – Continuing Excellence Award

Alexa Taylor is the 2012 winner of the Continuing Excellence Award. Alexa serves as Director at the Learning Enhancement Center specializing in assisting students with learning disabilities. Alexa's commitment to excellence is best seen in her work helping students and families transition to SMU. She guides students while they are here through individual counseling sessions. In addition, she advises a student group (Students for New Learning), and is involved in leadership in the Dallas Branch of the International Dyslexia Association. As one of her many supporters stated, "Alexa pushes solutions to the level of excellence, never settling for less than what will best serve a student, situation or the institution." Her lasting impact on students and their families has been recently affirmed by donations to the LEC based on her work.

Eddie Sinnott – Outstanding Leadership Award

The 2012 winner of the Outstanding Leadership Award, Eddie Sinnott is the Men's Head Swim Coach and 24 year loyal member of SMU. Under his leadership, the SMU swimming team has won 13 consecutive conference titles and seventeen top 25 finishes at the NCAA championships. He has led his student-athletes to victory and has helped to shape their lives. His students proudly share that Eddie has been a teacher by example as well as by teaching them to grow. One colleague stated "He has also been a great role model for me away from the workplace, and has helped me grow as a person. I can say without question that I am a better father, husband, son, coach and Mustang because of him." As well as being a leader in SMU Athletics, Eddie is a graduate of SMU and a true ambassador for this university.

Timothy Norris – Innovation Award

Timothy Norris, Director of Advisor Education, Media and Technology, is the 2012 winner of the Innovation Award. His creative, big picture approach, coupled with his extensive knowledge of technology, has made an enormous difference in how SMU students are served and how his area supports their advisors. Tim created and implemented student enrollment workshops and video tutorials at AARO enabling students to more efficiently enroll for their own classes. He created the Peruna Passport replacing the new student guide, and he restructured the advising system during AARO to allow advisors more personal time with students and allowed students to take ownership of their course design. Tim has improved efficiency for the Advising Center by piloting and launching an Automated Advising Worksheet and creating an automated appointment request system. A colleague states "It is not uncommon to find "people-persons" working in higher education. Nor is it uncommon to find "techies" at a university. Tim encapsulates the best of both worlds. He has great people skills as well as technical skills. He is a pleasure to work with - and someone who has truly made a difference at SMU."

Loretta Hawkins Staff Award

The Loretta Hawkins Staff Award was established to recognize and reward outstanding performance among University employees. Loretta O'Reilly Hawkins worked for SMU for thirty-seven years, as secretary and administrative assistant to three SMU presidents. Her influence on SMU was so well known that the Dallas Morning News published an editorial titled "Loretta's Leaving" when she announced her retirement in 1961. Dallas E. Hawkins II established this award to give the University "an opportunity to recognize and reward someone each year who has done an outstanding job" as a way to honor his mother's life and commitment to SMU.

Judy Henneberger

Judy is the Associate Chaplain to the University and has served the SMU community for 23 years. Judy's position requires her to be on call 24/7 visiting hospitals, arranging memorial services and standing in for the university chaplain.
