Inclement Weather Guidelines Found on Evergreen Website. As we head in to the winter season, we ask you to re-familiarize yourselves with the Inclement Weather and Emergency Operations Guidelines found here. Communications plans should include messages that direct faculty and students to this website. President Turner will make a formal announcement of any decisions related to campus closure or class cancellations, at which point all undergraduate courses and most graduate classes (with the exceptions listed on the website) must be cancelled and may not shift to technology-enhanced modes of learning. School-specific information boxes on the evergreen website outline which exceptions have been made for graduate and professional programs. Importance of On-Time Grade Submission. As we near graduation, we are also nearing the time of frequently asked questions about entering student grades. Please help communicate the importance of entering grades on time. Missing grades add many complications for our faculty and staff colleagues -- and for students-- in a variety of ways: staff time must be re-purposed for trouble-shooting when focus needs to be on other areas; students experience road blocks in getting job offers; schools cannot process probations/suspensions on time; graduate school applications are delayed; students who are athletes cannot be cleared to compete; and diplomas cannot be issued. Please help communicate the importance of entering grades on time (within 72 hours of the final scheduled exam) to shift away from this bottleneck of issues. SMU to Purchase SteppingBlocks Graduate Career Outcomes Platform. In Spring of 2024 SMU will be making a new tool available to academic departments to provide them access to data about graduate career and employment outcomes. SteppingBlocks is an Al-driven platform that will gather and provide data on SMU graduates, their career pathways and outcomes, and the skills they have used to get the jobs they have and the jobs they seek. The system has been adopted by universities across the country. Departments will be given access to the platform, once it is in place. Departments will be able to use the system to gain detailed information about market demand for students in their majors and degree programs. They will also be able to obtain detailed information about their graduates' employment outcomes as well as information about which skills acquired during their academic studies

students have leveraged in their careers. We hope that this platform will allow departments to better understand and leverage student employment outcomes, to guide students during their academic careers toward their desired career pathways, and to ensure SMU students are well-positioned for success after graduation. The Office of Institutional Planning and Effectiveness will communicate with departments and offer training on the system once it is in place.

Interested in Participating in the Fulbright Scholars-in-Residence Program? SMU will be applying to serve as a site for the Fulbright Scholars-in-Residence Program. We will be developing clear and written processes as a campus-wide effort to clarify the processes for bringing visiting scholars to SMU, providing them with faculty status, supporting them with HR and ISSS logistics, and helping them transition to the Dallas and the campus (e.g., office space, housing, etc.). We need to learn from department chairs about which countries or regions you would like to recruit from, as well as which specific disciplines in which we might want to host scholars.
