Important Upcoming Information on Schedule of Classes for May through Fall Terms 2024. Key milestones in building the schedule of classes are on the immediate horizon. Detailed instructions and processes for the room scheduling period will be distributed in early November, along with an invite to an overview meeting for all schedulers to be held on November 27. On November 6, the Production Calendar will be distributed to all departments and will include a full set of dates, milestones, and resources. On November 27, the Prior Term Copy will be run for May, Summer, August, and Fall terms. Please note—the deadline of Friday, February 9, for finalizing the schedules, is similar to past deadlines.
