

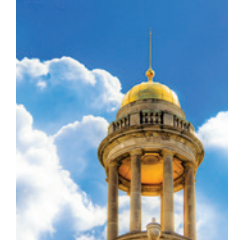

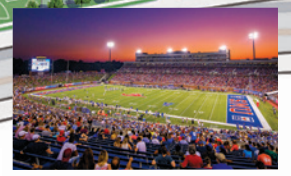
D Meadows Museum
