

Childcare and Preschool:

Private: Private schools often have more flexibility in their curriculum, teaching methods, and admission criteria compared to public schools. Many parents choose private schools for reasons such as smaller class sizes, specialized programs (such as Montessori or religious education), and a perceived higher quality of education. However, private schools generally require tuition or fees to cover operating costs since they do not receive funding from the government.
