Promotion and Tenure Guidelines: Updates. All departments must ensure that internal guidelines are consistent with the revisions to SMU <u>Policy 2.11 Guidelines for the Award of Rank and Tenure</u> that were finalized in 2022. Time-Sensitive Update on Turnitin Contract Negotiations. The Faculty Technology Council has been reviewing an unexpected and time-sensitive situation regarding SMU's new contract negotiations with the Turnitin anti-plagiarism platform used in Canvas. Due to unsustainable annual cost increases, there is a growing likelihood that Turnitin will be replaced by an equivalent but new anti-plagiarism tool for the upcoming academic year. As co-facilitators of the Faculty Technology Council, Paige Ware and Jason Warner have been seeking emergency feedback from this faculty governance group to help develop contingency plans to ensure a smooth transition. Please be aware that all technology changes cause some disruption; however, OIT will fully support and help mitigate disruptive experiences. Generative AI Syllabus Statement. We appreciate the input provided by faculty and students to help refine and finalize the Generative AI Syllabus Statement Builder. This link will be made available in Simple Syllabus for faculty as they decide how to communicate their expectations about classroom AI use. Faculty can also select from the two choices that were made available during the fall/spring 2023-24 academic year. Starting this fall 2024, all courses must include a statement on expectations for Generative AI use. The Provost's reminder about required syllabus language will be sent early next week.
