SMU GRADUATE COURSE WITH HEIGHTENED DLS REQUIREMENTS

CONTRACT/PROPOSAL

DLS students may take SMU graduate courses within the Graduate Liberal Studies department (MLS program) or in another SMU graduate department (on a space available/instructor-department consent basis) with heightened DLS requirements to fulfill their specialized study and program requirements. The heightened academic requirements beyond the methods of assessment listed include: a final written research paper for a total of 45-50 written pages, additional required texts for research, facilitation of groups/conversations, and stated relationship to the DLS student's doctoral thesis topic/issue. Additional components may include: weekly advanced graduate response papers based on readings, engaged learning components (creative writing, external service, etc.) and specific presentation/facilitation requirements.

To enroll in a Graduate Liberal Studies (MLS) course or other SMU graduate course outside of the GLS department at the Simmons School, students must work with a pre-approved GLS faculty member to define specific course requirements and complete this course proposal/contract subject to the approval of the Director and/or Faculty Chair/Dean. The deadline to submit proposals to the DLS office is at least four weeks before the beginning of the term for which the study is requested.

NOTE: In order for the expectations and evaluation methods to be clear to the student, the directing faculty member should provide a clear grading rubric and written assignment guidelines. Samples are available in the GLS office for review upon request.
