on the day immediately preceding or following a holiday or vacation may be counted by the instructor as two.

Chapel Attendance. All students, except those excused by the deans concerned, are required to attend chapel exercises two days a week. Any student failing properly to account for absences from chapel may be dropped from the rolls of the University as in the case of absences from class.

Church Attendance. All students will be required to attend divine worship at least once each Sunday in the church of their choice.

Conduct

It is the purpose of the University authorities to maintain a high standard both of scholarship and of character. Students who will not work are not desired, and immoral conduct will not be tolerated. A student whose conduct or influence is found to be detrimental to the best interests of the student body may be requested to withdraw; in cases of flagrant misconduct or continued violation of rules and regulations, the penalty will be suspension or expulsion.

The faculty invites the hearty co-operation of the Student Association in the maintenance of high standards and, as far as practicable, will rely upon student sentiment and student self-government for the enforcement of good conduct. All the actions of this Association are subject to review by the Committee on Discipline appointed by the general faculty.

All forms of hazing are positively prohibited and students on entrance are required to sign a pledge to refrain from the practice.

Each student agrees to leave the University and University neighborhood quietly and immediately when directed to do so by a constituted disciplinary authority of the University.

Matriculation in the University is a declaration of acceptance of all University rules and regulations.

Boarding Restrictions

It is the policy of the University to provide, as far as possible, for boarding students in its own dormitories, but students not required to live in the dormitories may secure board and rooms in approved private houses. Persons who

plan to furnish board and room for the operation of the University must submit a plan to the Board of Trustees for its approval. The plan must be approved by the Board of Trustees before the definite supervision of the operation will be held of all rules and regulations.

Men Studying. All freshmen are required to study in the University during their entire college career, with the exception of those who are on campus a holiday.

Women Studying. All freshmen are required to study in the University during their entire college career, with the exception of those who are on campus a holiday.

Pledging. No student is permitted to pledge before the commencement of the year in which the student enters the University.

Initiation. No student is permitted to initiate a student into a fraternity, sorority, or other organization, or for at least fifteen days before the commencement of the year of work. No student who has not passed the examination for admission to the University shall be permitted to initiate a student into a fraternity, sorority, or other organization, or for at least a year before the commencement of the year of work.
