## UNIVERSITY REGULATIONS

Matriculation in the University is a declaration of acceptance of all University rules and regulations.

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Conduct.—The University authorities expect students to maintain a high standard of scholarship, of character, and of consideration for others. A student whose conduct or influence is found to be detrimental to the best interests of the student body may be re-

quested to withdraw.

Dishonesty, gambling, hazing, immoral conduct, or any other behavior unbecoming to a student of Southern Methodist University render the student subject to disciplinary action. There shall be no drinking of intoxicating liquors at the University nor at be no drinking of intoxicating liquors at the University nor at functions of any University group. Flagrant misconduct or continued violation of the rules and regulations will merit suspentioned violation, as determined by The Faculty Committee on Distribution.

Discipline.

Each student agrees to leave the University and University neighborhood quietly and immediately when for reason he is direct-neighborhood quietly and immediately when for the University, ed to do so by a constituted disciplinary authority of the University.

The Deans of Men and Women are charged with the administration and enforcement of policies established by The Faculty Commirton on Discipline.

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The faculty welcomes the hearty cooperation of the Students Association in the maintenance of high standards, and relies upon student sentiment, and leadership in student self-government to support good conduct.

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Church Attendance.—All students are urged to attend divise worship each Sunday in the church of their choice.

Loss of Personal Property.—The University is not responsible for the loss of personal property belonging to students in any building owned by the University, whether the loss results from theft, fire or unknown cause.

Physical Education.—All freshmen and sophomores, whatever their purpose in entering the University, are required to take physical education or ROTC Air Science (for men), and must present four hours' credit in these courses to fulfill graduation requirement. Transfer students of senior standing who have no physical education credit may be graduated with a minimum of two hours' credit in physical education. Students not able to participate in a regular physical education program because of some physical defect will sassigned to a special class.
